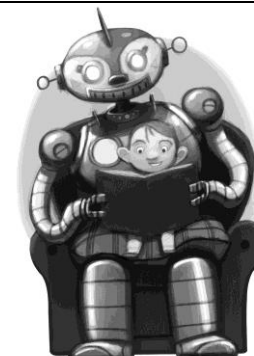

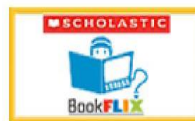
The best way to help your child learn to read is by reading to and with them every day!
